

Comprehension Task – A story with TWO questions.


The first question is a **short question asking you to locate information**.

The **second question** is based on a **character(s)**.

i.e.: What do you learn about a character(s) in the story?

You may use a bubble map to help you select relevant describing words for the character.

Then, when writing your answer, try to follow this little pattern:



This shows that she is protective and wants to reassure her daughter.

Now to add fluency to your answer you could connect your sentences to read like this:

The mother is loving because she "holds Joan's hand" which shows that she is protective and wants to reassure her daughter.

Keep using this pattern (P.E.E.) as you write what you learn about the character. (Your teacher will give you practice on this before the exam).


Try to take a new paragraph for each new point. You are expected to create 6-8 paragraphs.

Remember you may highlight or underline the comprehension to help you identify relevant evidence to support your explanation.

You may also annotate the comprehension by writing the words (adjectives) you would use to describe the character beside the evidence. This helps you PLAN your answer.

Always take care with **SPELLING**, **PUNCTUATION** and **GRAMMAR** in all tasks.

Important tips for the History Summer Exam

- 1. Always read the question and include only information which answers the question.
- 2. Remember when answering questions look at what it is asking you to do;
 - a) Identify requires you to write a short answer.
 - b) Describe and explain require you to write a longer answer, usually a paragraph.
 - c) Always look to see the mark allocation -a 1 mark question requires less detail than a 5 mark question.
- 3. When answering source questions...
 - ✓ Look at who has written the source.
 - ✓ When was it written?
 - ✓ Remember if the questions asks "<u>Using the source you must quote from the</u> source eg Source A states "..." and then explain.
 - ✓ If you do not quote, you will not get the marks.
 - ✓ Know the **difference between** primary evidence and secondary evidence.

- 1) **Musical elements** be able to discuss the elements in an unfamiliar piece of music: *pitch* (high, low), *dynamics* (loud or soft), *tempo* (fast or slow), *duration* (long or short notes), *texture* (thin or thick, layers of sound), *timbre/sonority*(instruments playing), and *structure* (binary, ternary, rondo)
- 2) Be able to identify **instruments of the orchestra** when heard in an unfamiliar piece of music
- 3) Be able to identify notes on the musical stave as A.B.C.D.E.F or G
- 4) Be able to **identify rhythms on the musical stave** as walk (crotchet), jogging (quavers) or stride (minim)



Tips for Science Test



- Know the topic inside out as it will be asked in different ways.
- Read the question at least twice before you attempt to answer it.
- Often questions in Science have a short introduction this is not done to use up a bit of space on the exam - it is there as it often contains valuable information that you will need to answer the question. Make sure you read it. Also, refer back to it if you get stuck at any point as this may have the information you require.
- Highlight key words in the question to show what exactly is being asked.
- Graphs if there is a graph, look at it carefully and read it
 accurately this may mean paying close attention to what the
 axes are labelled and to the units used.
